

Parent Ed Corner:

Encourage your children to make wise choices.

It is best, in the beginning, to give limited choices. For example: Would you like an apple or a banana in your lunch? Notice, the question is not "Would you like fruit in your lunch?"

Another example would be: Would you like to clean up the playroom before or after dinner? Again, the choice is not whether or not they want to, but when they would like to do so.
